

#### SMART Pathway/Great Redwood Trail Overview

- Will be 70+ miles at buildout
- 39 miles already completed, mostly Class I multi-use path
- 11 miles funded for construction in Novato, Santa Rosa, and between Windsor and Healdsburg
- Another 20+ miles planned/in design that are being positioned for grants for construction funding











#### **SMART Pathway- Future Segments**

- Consistent with SMART's 2025-2030 Strategic Plan, SMART continues to explore the feasibility of and planning for future pathway segments that were not environmentally cleared under the original SMART rail and pathway project
- In March 2025, SMART awarded a contract to BKF for the design, environmental clearance, and permitting for the Puerto Suello Pathway

## SMART Pathway Open Segments

- Longest segment of fully separated Class I is between E. Railroad Ave. and Joe Rodota Trail connecting Rohnert Park and Santa Rosa (8.8 miles)
- Longest section of open Pathway, consisting of off-road and on-road (Classes I, II, and III) is between Main St. in Penngrove and Rush Creek Pl. in Novato (15.6 miles)





#### Pathway and Rail Integration




- The train and pathway are complementary components of SMART's transportation system
- The pathway provides the first/last mile connection to the train
- In 2023, 54% of Pathway users reported regularly using a combination of the train and pathway to complete their trips



## Pathway and Rail Integration

- 13% of SMART train passengers bring bikes on board, many of whom ride on the Pathway
- In FY25, SMART carried 1,123,686 rail passengers, a 32% increase over the prior year
- In FY25, SMART carried 146,898
  bicycles, a 28% increase over the prior year








### **SMART Pathway Counts**

(total counts by Fiscal Year)






#### **SMART Pathway Average Daily Counts**

(August/September 2024 and 2025)


New segments contribute to growing usership, but there is growth of usership systemwide

(August/September 2024 and 2025)






#### **SMART Pathway Average Daily Counts**

(August/September 2024 and 2025)


Largest year over year gains are occurring on those segments connected to newly completed pathway
