#### **Emergency Bridge Repair (Brazos Branch)**


- November 2, 2022 Board approved emergency contract (Agenda item A) and its companion, Resolution No. 2022-37

- Update
  - Long-lead bridge timbers are currently in transit to Schellville
  - Contractor will return to make permanent repairs the week of February 13<sup>th</sup>

- Staff will bring list of recommended COC Members to the full board on February 15<sup>th</sup> for approval


#### Monthly Ridership (FY22 vs FY23)

#### Average Weekday Ridership




#### January Average Weekday ridership

  - Sonoma County -San Miguel Ave. to Airport Blvd. in Santa Rosa (\$2 million)



Federal Appropriation, State Funds & Measure M \$44 M




#### Windsor / Healdsburg Funding (Secured + Restored)






#### Windsor / Healdsburg Funding (Secured + Restored + Expanded)

- Remaining Funds Required: \$113 M




