"Without raising taxes, to continue relieving traffic congestion on Highway 101; reducing carbon pollution; providing reliable public transportation and pathways to serve residents of Sonoma and Marin Counties, including seniors, students, essential workers, and low-income households; completing rail service and biking/walking pathways between Larkspur and Cloverdale, shall an extension of the existing Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit District 1/4-cent voter approved sales tax, at the same rate, generating approximately \$51,000,000 annually for an additional 30 years, subject to public disclosure, be adopted?"

NOW I WOULD LIKE TO ASK A FEW MORE QUESTIONS ABOUT SMART. AS YOU MAY KNOW, SONOMA-MARIN AREA RAIL TRANSIT (SMART) IS THE NORTH BAY'S PASSENGER RAIL SERVICE. THE CURRENT 45-MILE SYSTEM INCLUDES STATIONS IN THE SONOMA COUNTY AIRPORT AREA, SANTA ROSA, ROHNERT PARK, COTATI, PETALUMA, NOVATO, SAN RAFAEL, AND LARKSPUR. SMART'S SYSTEM ALSO INCLUDES A BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN PATHWAY ALONG THE RAIL CORRIDOR.

ADDITIONAL STATIONS ARE UNDER CONSTRUCTION FOR PETALUMA AND WINDSOR WITH FUTURE EXTENSIONS PLANNED FOR HEALDSBURG AND CLOVERDALE. AT COMPLETION THE PROJECT WILL PROVIDE 70 MILES OF PASSENGER RAIL SERVICE AND BIKING AND WALKING PATHWAYS, CONNECTING SMART PASSENGERS WITH JOBS, EDUCATION CENTERS, RETAIL HUBS AND HOUSING ALONG THE SONOMA-MARIN CORRIDOR.
